"HE DIDN'T PRAY THAT WE WOULD BE UNIFIED. HE PRAYED THAT WE WOULD BE ONE."

READ

Colossians 1:12-22

There is only one true living God. Any others are creations of man. He describes Himself as "merciful and gracious, long-suffering, and abounding in goodness and truth, forgiving iniquity and transgression." While He is one God, He is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We see this plurality in Genesis; "Let Us make man in Our image." The Father is that indescribable, majestic Being that cannot be comprehended, and no man has seen Him. Jesus is the second member of the Trinity, no less powerful or glorious. As Jesus ultimately gave His life, the Spirit drew men to Himself. Still today, the Holy Spirit guides us to Jesus.
